We'd also like to thank Music Voice for featuring ANTI-M in the "NU 2 U" column. We really appreciate the supportive recognition and would like to say for the record that we are definitely new to the Phoenix rock scene. ANTI-M was formed in December of '89 in a small town south of Tucson, but didn't move to Phoenix until March of '91. At that time the band played a handful of shows with a different line-up than the current band. Shortly thereafter the band split up, so very few people in Phoenix saw the band before we reformed in January this year. The band has downsized from a 5-piece to a 4-piece, has completely different material, and has a new drummer (Roger Wiedabach from Milwaukee). So although the name has been around, ANTI-M is a Phoenix band that is positively "NU 2 U."

Something our more observant readers may have noticed on our schedule is the fact that two of our dates are at "conferences". We are working on a plan to tour some major colleges in the Southwest later this year, and these conferences will put us in touch with the people who will book us at their colleges. Since they require promo material, video tapes and audio demos (not to mention the applicable fees), you can imagine that we're pretty busy. We feel that this step would be a major move toward achieving national recognition, and who knows where we can go from there, right?

While we're on the subject of demos and promo and all that stuff, we'd also like to let you know about some of our plans. In the near future, we expect to complete a two or three song demo for purposes of promotion. We'll be giving some of these cassettes away at our local shows, so if you like our material, stay tuned for further details. Another promo idea we have is sponsoring our own warehouse party. We'd like to know what people think about this idea, so if you have a few minutes, call our hotline (230-4118) and give us your opinion. We'd like to know where and when most people would like to see this kind of event happen.

We would also like to mention that there's another way to find out more about Anti-M (as if we weren't telling you enough). It's a FREE service called "The Eye"; you may have seen their flyers around town. It works as an information service based on voice mail. You can find out about bar & club information, local and statewide events and a lot more. You can also hear recorded interviews of your favorite band (Anti-M) if you choose to do so.
